Downtown San Marcos Welcomes a New Addition with an Artsy Flare

San Marcos, Texas – Kyle Reese is the proud new owner of 173 S. LBJ in downtown San Marcos. Along with moving his Houston lighting restoration and antique collectables business, Stewart Douglas, Reese is envisioning an artsy addition to downtown. His business will only occupy a small section of the over 10,000 square foot building and Reese dreams of turning the remaining space into a community theater and art gallery. Reese is meeting with several members of the local arts community to develop a plan to renovate his building. Several local artists and sculptors have already contacted Reese for potential show space in the upcoming gallery.

Reese began Stewart Douglas as a lighting restoration company but it has evolved into a unique shopping experience. Stewart Douglas now offers curios, antiques, jewelry, and nature's art in addition to lighting design, sales, and restoration. Reese restores unique and antique lamps and lighting fixtures.
